## A solid start for the Dutch first thousand days-approach: Insights into program adoption, monitoring and cross-sectoral collaboration

- 1. It is important to consider both risk and protective factors to vulnerability around pregnancy, as risk factors alone don't tell the full story. [this thesis]
- 2. In order to advance health equity for parents and children, we need to intervene early in life (adapted from National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine, 2019)
- 3. Strangers are strangers until they meet (Chef'Special, in: Amigo). Getting to know each other is a crucial first step to collaboration. [this thesis]
- 4. Always look on the bright side developing an integrated and population health-based care and support system is challenging, yet we take steps forward every day (adapted from Stein et al., 2022)
- 5. Learning is not a one-time event or a periodic luxury; continuous learning processes are essential (adapted from Amy Edmondson)
- 6. Monitoring a solid start requires longitudinal cross-sectoral data, and efforts should be made to enrich routinely collected data with data on self-reported health and experiences. [this thesis]
- 7. Balancing a top-down and bottom-up approach was key in the adoption of the Dutch first thousand days-approach. [this thesis]
- 8. Investing in programs for a good start in life remains justifiable even without conclusive evidence of immediate effects. [this thesis]
- 9. We have to safeguard a good start in life across all policies and legislations (adapted from the Dutch Council of Public Health & Society (RVS), 2023)
- 10. The Dutch first thousand days-approach had a solid start. [this thesis]
- 11. If we change the beginning of the story, we change the whole story (World Health Organization, 2018)
- 12. Knowledge derived from research, practice, and experience are all indispensable for a solid start.
- 13. A journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step (Lao Tzu). This applies to children's lives, monitoring, cross-sectoral collaboration as well as completing your PhD.
